Northwest Baptist Seminary invites applications for a full-time faculty position in theology and cross-cultural leadership for Canadian online and residential graduate degree programs offered in Korean language. The position is an assistant professor role. The person hired would also provide some administrative support for managing some aspects of an online MA degree program, as well as assist with other usual academic processes.

Northwest Baptist Seminary (NBS) offers a Doctor of Ministry in Global Christian Leadership (Korean language) and manages for the Associated Canadian Theological Schools a Master of Divinity Degree (Korean language) and Master of Arts (Global Christian Leadership, Korean language). All degrees are ATS accredited. NBS is developing a fully online Master of Arts in Cross-cultural Christian Leadership and anticipates launching this program in January 2020 with all approvals and accreditation in place.

A successful candidate will be thoroughly bi-lingual in English and Korean, possess a Ph.D. or its equivalent in cross-cultural leadership or missiology, from a reputable institution in North America, Great Britain, Europe, or South Africa, have experience teaching at graduate level and be able to sign their agreement with the Seminary's Statement of Faith and Code of Conduct. Cross-cultural ministry experience in a leadership role is also important for this position. Evidence of research and publication would provide additional support for an applicant. Applicants should submit a curriculum vitae, three letters of reference (one from an academic mentor), evidence of teaching experience and quality, and a one or two-page statement describing their personal faith commitment and how this shapes their academic and professional life. Terms and benefits to be negotiated. The Seminary seeks to fill this position early in the Fall of 2019. Canadian citizens and permanent residents who meet the criteria will be given priority.

Position Description: The person in this position will serve to develop and manage the MA in Cross-cultural Leadership for NBS Korean Programs, and to teach regularly online courses in this program and other NBS Korean Language Programs.

Title: Assistant Professor (faculty) in Cross-cultural Christian Leadership for NBS Korean programs.

Accountability: to Korean Program co-directors (Dr. Brynjolfson and Dr. Park), Korean Programs KMA/KMDV, and NBS Dean (Dr. Howard Anderson).

Primary responsibilities:

1. **Teaching:** teaching focus would be in the cross-cultural leadership courses such as MCL 500, CCL 510 and CCL 660, as well as other courses in the area of Global Leadership Studies that engage cross-cultural leadership issues
 - a. Initially the course load is to develop and teach at least one online course per semester as well as other courses in the KMA and KMDV.
2. **Academic Management:**
 - a. To manage KMA-CCL online courses including:
 - i. Overseeing the development of all new courses necessary for implementing the program,
 - ii. Overseeing the production and management of online course materials,
 - iii. Assisting and orienting faculty in the production of course content, and in the delivery of online learning,
 - iv. Trouble-shooting student issues.
 - b. To assist Dr. Brynjolfson and Dr. Park in the overall management of the Korean online programs.
3. **Recruiting and Admissions:**
 - a. To assist Dr. Park with recruiting as needed and able.
 - b. To liaise with ACTS Admissions.
 - c. To assist applicants in the ACTS admission process.
4. **Student support:**
 - a. To liaise with and support students.
 - b. To ensure students have adequate orientation and support to complete online courses.
 - c. To be a mentor to KMA-CCL students.

This position would be a 1.0 position starting October 2019. The person hired for this position would be asked to contribute further teaching in an overload capacity from time to time.

Qualifications:

1. Ph.D. or its equivalent in cross-cultural leadership or missiology.
2. Experience in teaching graduate students and experience teaching online courses.
3. Demonstrated research and publications (e.g., articles, blogs, reports, books, academic paper presentations, etc.).
4. Significant cross-cultural ministry experience with some experience in a leadership capacity.
5. Agreement with the NBS Statement of Faith, Mission, and Code of Conduct.
6. Agreement to become part of the Fellowship of Evangelical Baptist Churches in British Columbia.
7. Meet all other employee standards stated in the NBS Employee Handbook.
8. Able to teach in Korean and in English.

Additional Considerations:

1. Familiarity with Moodle Learning Management System (LMS) is an asset.
2. Academic administration experience is an asset.

Terms:

1. Salary and benefits to be negotiated but consistent with the NBS Faculty salary grid.
2. The appointment initially is for one year, but with possible appointment to a second year and to continuing status in the third year, following normal evaluation processes.
3. It is anticipated that the position would begin late in 2019.
